## Health Care Eligibility

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**Health Care Eligibility for 5 Years for Combat Veterans** — Enroll for health care at any VA medical center following your military separation date and you can receive your health care at the VA right away (based on eligibility). Once you enroll, the VA is available to serve your health care needs for years to come — but you must enroll within five years from separation for enhanced combat benefits.

**Dental Benefits** — You may be eligible for one-time dental care, but must apply for a dental exam within 180 days of your separation date and we must verify your eligibility from your DD-214.

**Veterans Crisis Line** — The Veterans Crisis Line connects Veterans in crisis and their families and friends with qualified, caring Department of Veterans Affairs responders through a confidential toll-free hotline and online chat. ## Directions to VA Medical Center

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**North** - Take 65 South to Exit 114 (Martin Luther King/West Streets).\*

**South** - Take 65 North to Exit 114 (Martin Luther King/West Streets).\*

**West** - Take 70 East to 65 North to Exit 114 (Martin Luther King/West Streets).\*

**East** - Take 70 West to 65 North to Exit 114 (Martin Luther King/West Streets).\*

*\*Turn west (right) at first stoplight. Continue west on 10th Street to the Roudebush VA Medical Center.*
